DESCRIPTION OF THE LEVELS



English Qualifications

C1 Advanced

C1 Advanced is the in-depth, high-level qualification that shows you have the language skills that **employers** and **universities** are looking for.

A C1 Advanced qualification shows that you can:

- follow an academic course at university level
- communicate effectively at a managerial and professional level
- participate with confidence in workplace meetings or academic tutorials and seminars
- express yourself with a high level of fluency

C2 Proficiency

C2 Proficiency is the **highest-level** Cambridge English qualification – proof that you are a **highly competent** speaker of English.

A C2 Advanced qualification shows that you can:

- study demanding subjects at the highest level, including postgraduate and PhD programmes
- negotiate and persuade effectively at senior management level in international business settings
- understand the main ideas of complex pieces of writing
- talk about complex or sensitive issues, and deal confidently with difficult questions.

Exam Format

Both the C1 Advanced and the C2 Proficiency are rigorous and thorough tests of English at a high level. They cover all four language skills – reading, writing, listening and speaking – and include a fifth element focusing on the candidate's understanding of the structure of the language. There are four papers and the overall focus of each test is as follows:

Reading and Use of English: 1 hour 30 minutes

Candidates need to be able to understand texts from publications such as fiction and non-fiction books, journals, newspapers and magazines.

Writing: 1 hour 30 minutes

Candidates have to show that they can produce two different pieces of writing: a compulsory essay in Part 1, and one from a choice of three tasks in Part 2.

Listening: 40 minutes (approximately)

Candidates need to show they can understand the meaning of a range of spoken material, including lectures, radio broadcasts, speeches and talks.

Speaking: 15/16 minutes

Candidates take the Speaking test with another candidate or in a group of three, and are tested on their ability to take part in different types of interaction: with the examiner, with the other candidate and by themselves.

When do the exams take place?



There are exam sessions held multiple times throughout the year so students are able to enrol whenever they reach the necessary level, usually either at the end of Y12 or mid Y13.
